Balance of Works – Ensure a mix of sizes and media to create visual interest.

Eye-Level Positioning – Place the most important pieces at viewer's eye level.

Spacing & Flow – Avoid overcrowding; leave enough space between works.

Grouping by Concept or Medium – Helps maintain visual and thematic cohesion.

Lighting – Ensure appropriate lighting to highlight details without glare or shadows.

Safe Placement – Securely mount works to prevent damage or accidents. Interactivity (if applicable) – Consider movement paths for audience engagement.
