CAS Reflection Prompts Template

Encourage deeper connections between experiences and personal growth through guided questions

Before / Planning Stage (Investigation & Preparation)

Reflect before you begin, as you plan your CAS experience:

- Why did I choose this experience? What values or beliefs influence my choice?
- What assumptions do I already have about this activity, community, or challenge?
- How do I expect this experience to change me?
- In what ways might different perspectives (cultural, ethical, personal) shape the way I approach this?
- What TOK concepts (e.g., ethics, perspectives, bias) might connect to this experience?

During the Experience (Action)

Reflect while you are actively engaged:

- What knowledge or skills am I developing that I didn't expect?
- What challenges am I facing, and how am I adjusting my approach?
- How do collaboration and communication with others affect the outcome?
- Am I noticing tensions between what I thought I knew and what I am learning now?
- How might different "ways of knowing" (emotion, reason, sense perception, imagination) influence my decisions here?

After the Experience (Reflection & Demonstration)

Reflect once the activity is completed:

- What surprised me most about this experience? Why?
- How has this experience changed the way I see myself, others, or the world?
- Did I face any ethical dilemmas? How did I navigate them, and what does that reveal about my values?

- What TOK question could I ask to deepen my understanding of this experience (e.g., "How do we know what is the right action?")?
- How does this experience connect to global issues, and how might my actions contribute to broader change?

Long-Term / Portfolio-Level Reflection

Reflect across your CAS journey:

- Looking back, how have my CAS experiences shaped my personal identity and learner profile?
- Which CAS strand (Creativity, Activity, Service) pushed me out of my comfort zone the most, and why?
- In what ways have I developed new perspectives about knowledge, culture, or community through CAS?
- How have my CAS experiences helped me see the interconnectedness between personal growth, ethical responsibility, and global citizenship?
- What will I carry forward from CAS into my life beyond the IB Diploma?

→ Student Note: Reflection is not about reporting "what happened"
— it's about making meaning. Be honest, thoughtful, and critical. Ask yourself TOK-style questions: How do I know this? Whose perspective am I considering? What knowledge or values shaped my decision?
